

More Ideas

- Build a model of a tree - *you can include a tree as a habitat by including insects, birds, animals, and so on..*
- Forest Acrostics - *Falling leaves, Outdoor education, Renewable resource, Environment for many living things, Succession, Trails.*
- Flip Book: Layers of the forest - *canopy, understory, shrubs, fern, litter, soil*
- Write a thank you note to a tree - *maybe one that you saw on the trail.*
- Make a Puzzle - *pick a tree found on the trail, draw a picture of it, and cut it into a puzzle.*
- Picture Dictionary - *create a picture dictionary of terms learned after the field trip.*
- Tree Product Mobile - *create a mobile of different tree products using construction paper or items brought from home.*
- Forestry Careers -
 - **research a career and design a poster or a brochure to inform others about a forestry career. Definition of a forester: someone that studies the many things a forest provides such as timber, recreation, water, wildlife, food, and beauty. Careers include: soil scientist, truck driver, mill technician, forester, hydrologist, logger, wildlife manager, park ranger, forest engineer, forestry educator, silviculturist (studies how trees grow), wood scientist (develops wood products).*
 - **Have students choose a forestry career to research. Then students can present their project in the role of the chosen forestry career. For example, if a student chose a park ranger to research, they would study information on that career and do a presentation dressed up in similar attire to a park ranger.*
